****Waiver of Bagley-Keene Restriction on Teleconferenced Meetings Related to Declared Emergency – (Executive Order N-29-20, March 17, 2020, paragraph 11.):*** Executive Order N-29-20 waives some requirements regarding the notification and access for teleconferenced public meetings. Specifically, it would allow a Board to conduct Board business via a telephonic meeting and allow the members to call in from private lines without making those numbers public or requiring the sites from which they call to be accessible to the public. One site must be posted as publicly accessible, and this public site need not include an appointed Board member.

 - A. Consideration to Increase Class Size.
 - i. **American Career College, Anaheim, Vocational Nursing Program – Dr. Fairchild, Nursing Education Consultant.**
NEC Recommendations:
 1. Deny American Career College, Anaheim, Vocational Nursing program’s request to increase class size from 50 students to 60 students for each part-time class, starting with the projected July 6, 2020 class.
 2. Require the program to demonstrate students are scheduled for clinical experiences in Board approved clinical facilities to meet 50% of clinical hours in a hands-on clinical setting during the COVID-19 pandemic.

3. Place the program on the November 19, 2020 Board meeting agenda for reevaluation of resources and reconsideration of request to increase class size from 50 students to 60 students for each part-time class.
4. Require the program director to submit the following documents by the 15th day two months prior to the November 19, 2020 Board meeting:
 - Current facility roster
 - Current faculty roster
 - Faculty/facility assignments
 - Enrollment table, including projected class
 - Course calendar for term 1 for projected class
 - Submit documentation that will be given to potential students informing the student that the class may pause due to 50% of simulation being met.
5. Require the program director to submit documentation of adequate resources demonstrating scheduled clinical sites by October 30, 2020 for the projected January 2021 part-time class.
6. Continue to require the program to comply with all approval standards in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing at Business and Professions Code Section 2880, and Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16.

B. Consideration of Provisional Approval.

i. Gurnick Academy of Medical Arts, San Mateo, Vocational Nursing Program – Ms. Silverman, Nursing Education Consultant.

NEC Recommendations:

1. Place the Gurnick Academy of Medical Arts, San Mateo, Vocational Nursing Program on provisional approval for the two-year period beginning August 21, 2020; and issue a certificate accordingly.
2. Issue a notice of change in Approval Status to the program identifying specific areas of non-compliance and requirements for correction as referenced in Section 2526.1 and Section 2530(l) of the California Code of Regulations.
3. Require the program to submit an action plan to correct their NCLEX-PN® first time testers pass rate by October 1, 2020.
4. Require the program to admit no additional classes without prior approval by the Board.
5. Require the program to submit a report to the Board in six months, no later than March 15, 2021, and fifteen months, no later than June 15, 2022. The report must include a comprehensive analysis of the program, timeline for implementation, and the effect of employed interventions. The following elements must be addressed in the analysis.
 - a. Terminal Objectives
 - b. Evaluation of Current CurriculumPlease submit:

 - 2- Theory and Clinical Objectives for each Term
 - 3- Lesson Plans for each Term
 - c. Student Policies to include:
 - 1- Admission Policy

 - 6- Credit Granting Policy
 - d. Evaluations of Approved Clinical Facilities which determine adequacy in number and variety to accommodate current and projected students.
 - e. Evaluations of Theory and Clinical Faculty
 - f. Methodologies for:
 - 1- Faculty Meetings
 - 2- Clinical Evaluations
 - g. Evaluations of interventions implemented to increase the programs annual average pass rates.
6. Require the program to provide no less than one instructor for every ten students in clinical experiences.
 7. Require the program to comply with all approval standards in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing at Business and Professionals Code, section 2880, and Article 5 of the Board's Regulations, commencing at California Code of Regulations, Title 16, section 2526.
 8. Require the program to demonstrate incremental progress in correcting the violations. If the program fails to satisfactorily demonstrate incremental progress, the full Board may revoke the program's approval.
 9. Place the program on the Board's August 2022 agenda for reconsideration of provisional approval.

ii. Southeast California College, Vocational Nursing Program – Ms. Silverman, Nursing Education Consultant.

NEC Recommendations:

1. Deny the Southeast California College, Vocational Nursing Program request to admit one class of 17 students on August 3, 2020, only.
2. Place the Southeast California College, Vocational Nursing Program on provisional approval for the two-year period beginning August 21, 2020; and issue a certificate accordingly.
3. Issue a notice of change in approval status to the program identifying specific areas of non-compliance and requirements for correction as referenced in Section 2526.1 and Section 2530(I) of the California Code of Regulations.
4. Require the program to submit an action plan to correct their NCLEX-PN® first time takers score of zero percent passing by October 1, 2020.

5. Require the program to admit no additional classes without prior approval by the Board.
6. Require the program to submit a report to the Board in six months, no later than March 15, 2021, and fifteen months, no later than June 15, 2022. The report must include a comprehensive analysis of the program, timeline for implementation, and the effect of employed interventions. The following elements must be addressed in the analysis.
 - a. Terminal Objectives
 - b. Evaluation of Current Curriculum including:
 - 1- Instructional Plan
 - 2- Theory Objectives for each Term
 - 3- Clinical Objectives for each Term
 - 4- Lesson Plans for each Term

 - g. Documentation of required clinical resources for all terms for all current cohorts.
7. Require the program to provide no less than one instructor for every ten students in clinical experiences.
8. Require the program to comply with all approval standards in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing at Business and Professionals Code, section 2880, and Article 5 of the Board's Regulations, commencing at California Code of Regulations, Title 16, section 2526.
9. Require the program to demonstrate incremental progress in correcting the violations. If the program fails to satisfactorily demonstrate incremental progress, the full Board may revoke the program's approval.
10. Place the program on the Board's August 2022 agenda for reconsideration of provisional approval.
