#### Background:

In 2018, it was identified that the Board had not had a fee increase in more than ten (10) years. Effective January 1, 2019, the Board implemented the provisions of Senate Bill 1480 (Hill, Chapter 571 of the Statutes of 2018). SB 1480 amended the Board's fee structure to maintain the operation of the Board and restore funds in its reserve.

The Department of Consumer Affairs Budget Office (Budget Office) has since identified that the fees enacted by the 2018 legislation are no longer adequate to cover the Board's expenditures and do not address the increase in future operational costs. The Budget Office projects that the Board will deplete its existing reserve fund by Fiscal Year 2022-23 and recommends increasing the Board's Applicant, Licensee, Continuing Education Provider, and all other fees to help address costs.

On August 21, 2020, the Board voted to initiate the regulations process for the Applicant, Licensee, and Continuing Education Program Provider Fees for vocational nurses and psychiatric technicians up to the amounts detailed in the documents provided to the Board titled "Proposed, Fee Changes Language and Simple List of Fee Changes." This was proposed to increase the Applicant, Licensee, and Continuing Education Program Provider Fees by an amount of fifty-five dollars (\$55.00) with a twenty-five percent (25%) increase of ancillary fees.

After additional monitoring and analysis, Board staff, with the concurrence of the Budget Office, have determined that the partial fee increases previously authorized by the Board in August 2020 will not be sufficient to correct the structural imbalance. As such, the Budget Office has recommended that the Board increase all current fees to the maximum amounts authorized by law.

### Other Factors Affecting Fund Condition

#### Update and implementation of <u>AB 1536</u> (Committee on Business and Professions)

The Legislature convened the Board's Sunset Review and Hearing in March 2021. The findings and discussions of the hearing, enacted by AB 1536 directs the Board, in part, to:

- Establish an approval process with specified timelines for the review and approval of school applicants.
- Establish a fee schedule for new school approval.
- Reduce the continuing approval fee for programs experiencing state funding reduction resulting in enrollment capacity reduction.
- Use a reduced fee of \$5,000 for the final approval of an approved school or program affiliate-applicant in good standing that utilizes the curriculum approved by the Board.
- Adopt emergency regulations by June 30, 2022 to establish an approval process for proposed schools.
- Maintain a list of inactive schools seeking board approval.

### <u>Fees</u>

AB 1536, as signed into law effective January 1, 2022, authorizes the Board to assess the following fees for educational programs:

- Initial Application Fee of \$5,000.
- Final Approval Fee of \$15,000.
- Continuing Approval Fee of \$5,000 (every four years).

These fees result in an annual projected revenue of \$700,000 a year.

#### **Implementation**

To implement the administrative requirements of AB 1536, the Board's Education Division will require two (2) two-year, Limited Term Nursing Education Consultants (NECs), and one (1) Associate Governmental Program Analyst (AGPA). These positions will address the Education Division's program applicant backlog and strengthen the Board's regulatory oversight of existing programs.

### **Current Fund Condition Summary**

The Board will not begin to realize the new revenue authorized by AB 1536 until July 1, 2022. Despite the anticipated revenue from school program fees, the Board's fund suffers continued structural imbalance and faces insolvency as early as January 2023. Moreover, the Board's implementation of the administrative provisions of AB 1536 results in new costs exceeding 500,000—more than 70% of the new anticipated revenue provided by AB 1536. The attached document, Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians Analysis of Fund Condition – 2022-23 Baseline (status quo) demonstrates the Fund Condition without the proposed fee increase or the anticipated revenue from new school fees. #### **Review of Recent Action and Current Recommendation**

The Budget Office has advised the Board to commence rulemaking to implement the full statutory provisions of Senate Bill 1480 (Hill) to increase all Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technician Applicant, Licensee, Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technician Continuing Education Provider fees, and all other fees, effective January 1, 2023. This increase will yield a little more than 3 million dollars annually and address the Board's structural imbalance and impending insolvency in the short term if fee increases are adopted by January 1, 2023.

On August 20, 2021, the Board voted to increase the fees for application for licensure, examination for licensure, and renewal of licensure relating to Vocational Nurses to the full amount permitted by statute. However, no text was presented to the Board for approval at this meeting. Regulatory Counsel has advised that this text must be presented to the Board for approval to legally authorize the fee increases for the rulemaking process.

The proposed text of Sections 2537, 2537.1, 2590 and 2590.1 of Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations is included for your review and consideration.

Board staff recently completed desk audits. The outcome of the desk audit confirmed that the actual cost to process the Board's Applicant, Licensee, Continuing Education Provider and all other fees exceeds the current fee as well as the statutory maximum. The attached document "List of Proposed Fee Changes" outlines the Board's current fees charged for the processing of each of its fee categories, the maximum fee in statute and the proposed fee increase to the statutory maximum, and the actual cost to process each application or other item listed in the Board's fee schedules.

§ 2537. Fees.

Pursuant to section 2895 of the Code, the following fees are established:

(a) The fee to be paid upon the filing of an application for licensure by examination by applicants who have successfully completed the prescribed course of study in a California approved vocational nursing program is two<u>three</u> hundred twenty dollars (\$220300).

(b) The fee to be paid upon the filing of an application for licensure by examination by applicants who are qualified to take the examination by methods other than that specified in section 2537 (a) is twothree hundred fiftythirty dollars (\$250330).

(c) The fee to be paid upon the filing of an application for licensure by endorsement is two three hundred twenty dollars (\$220300).

(d) The fee to be paid for taking each examination for licensure shall be the actual cost to purchase the examination from a vendor approved by the board.

(e) The fee to be paid for any <u>re-examination</u> for licensure after the first <u>attempt</u> is two <u>three</u> hundred twenty dollars (\$220300).

(f) The biennial renewal fee to be paid upon the filing of an application for renewal is two three hundred twenty dollars (\$220300). In addition, an assessment of five dollars (\$5) shall be collected and credited to the Vocational Nurse Education Fund, pursuant to Section 2895.5 of the Code. If a license is renewed more than 30 days after its expiration, the renewal fee for the current cycle shall be the renewal fee in effect on the date the renewal fee is paid.

(g) Notwithstanding Section 163.5 of the Code, the delinquency fee for failure to pay the biennial renewal fee within the prescribed time is one hundred ten<u>fifty</u> dollars (\$110 150).

(h) The initial license fee is an amount equal to the biennial renewal fee in effect on the date the application for the license is filed.

(i) The fee to be paid for an interim permit is twenty fifty dollars (\$2050).

(j) The fee to be paid for a duplicate license or wall certificate is twenty-five<u>fifty</u> dollars (\$2550).

(k) The fee to be paid for processing verification of licensure papers to other states is one hundred <u>fifty</u> dollars (\$<del>100</del><u>150</u>).

(I) The fee to be paid for post-licensure certification in intravenous therapy, blood withdrawal or intravenous therapy with blood withdrawal is twenty fifty dollars (\$2050).

(m) The penalty fee for submitting insufficient funds or fictitious check, draft, or money order on any bank or depository for payment of any fee to the Board is twenty-five dollars (\$25).

§ 2537.1. Provider's Fees.

(b) The biennial renewal fee for any provider of a course in continuing education is <u>onetwo</u> hundred fifty dollars (\$150250).

(c) The fee to be paid upon filing of an application from any provider of a course in Intravenous Therapy is one two hundred fifty dollars (\$150250)

(d) The biennial renewal fee for any provider of a course in Intravenous Therapy is one two hundred fifty dollars (\$150250).

(e) The fee to be paid upon filing of an application from any provider of a course in Blood Withdrawal is one two hundred fifty dollars (\$150250).

(f) The biennial renewal fee for any provider of a course in Blood Withdrawal is one two hundred fifty dollars (\$150250).

§ 2590. Fees.

(b) The fee to be paid upon the filing of an application for licensure by examination by applicants qualified to take the examination by methods other than that specified in Section 2590 (a) is twothree hundred ninetyseventy-five dollars (\$295375).

(c) The fee to be paid upon the filing of an application for licensure by endorsement is twothree hundred twenty dollars (\$220300).

(d) The fee to be paid for taking each examination for licensure shall be the actual cost to purchase an examination from a vendor approved by the board.

(e) The fee to be paid for any <u>re-</u>examination for licensure after the first <u>attempt</u> is two three hundred <u>sixtyforty</u>-five dollars (\$<del>265</del><u>345</u>).

(f) The biennial renewal fee to be paid upon the filing of an application for renewal is twothree hundred twenty dollars (\$220300). If a license is renewed more than 30 days after its expiration, the renewal fee for the current cycle shall be the renewal fee in effect on the date the renewal fee is paid.

(g) Notwithstanding Section 163.5 of the Code, the delinquency fee for failure to pay the biennial renewal fee within the prescribed time is one hundred ten<u>fifty</u> dollars (\$110 <u>150</u>).

(h) The initial license fee is an amount equal to the biennial renewal fee in effect on the date the application for the license is filed.

(i) The fee to be paid for an interim permit twenty fifty dollars (\$2050).

(j) The fee to be paid for a duplicate license or wall certificate is twentyfifty dollars (\$<del>20</del>50).

(k) The fee to be paid for processing endorsement verification of licensure papers to other states is twenty fifty dollars (\$2050).

(I) The fee to be paid for post-licensure certification in blood withdrawal is twenty<u>fifty</u> dollars (\$<del>20</del>50).

(m) The penalty fee for submitting insufficient funds or fictitious check, draft, or money order on any bank or depository for payment of any fee to the Board is twenty-five dollars (\$25).

§ 2590.1. Provider Fees

Pursuant to Section 4518.1 of the Code, the following fees are established:

(a) The fee to be paid upon filing of an application for any provider of a course in continuing education is <del>one</del>two hundred fifty dollars (\$150 <u>250</u>).

(b) The biennial renewal fee for any provider of a course in continuing education is one two hundred fifty dollars (\$150 250).

(c)The fee to be paid upon filing of an application from any provider of a course in Blood Withdrawal is one two hundred fifty dollars (\$150,250).

(d) The biennial renewal fee for any provider of a course in Blood Withdrawal is one two hundred fifty dollars (\$150 250).
