- 1. Call to Order Ms. Carpenter called the meeting to order at 4:05 p.m.
- Update on Licensing Staffing Ms. Yamaguchi introduced Ms. Raney as the new Chief for the Division. Ms. Carpenter welcomed Ms. Raney. Ms. Brown provided the staffing updates, noting the recent transitions, and the status of recent recruitments. At the moment, there are four vacancies in Licensing, but two of those will be filled in the next two weeks.
- 3. Review of Licensing Performance Measures and Statistics Ms. Brown walked through the current statistics. Despite the short-handedness, the team continues to meet the processing time goals. The complete tables of statistics will be included in the Board report. The high point has been our work on the phones, answering more than 95 percent of incoming calls, with a wait time generally less than one minute.

4. Suggestions for Future Agenda Items

Ms. Yamaguchi briefly describd the next steps for the review of the Board's Strategic Plan, and said that she hoped that they would be able to have a full committee after the February Board meeting.
