PROGRAM	Stanbridge University, Los Angeles, Vocational Nursing Program (Program) (Program Director: Sabir Uddin, Los Angeles, Los Angeles County, Private)

Please note: Board Nursing Education Consultants make recommendations. The recommendations are forwarded to the Education and Practice Committee for review and recommendation or to the Executive Officer or full Board for action.

PROGRAM REQUEST:

Revise the pattern of admission from admission of four full-time classes of 45 students a year and three part-time classes of 45 students a year replacing graduating classes only to four full-time classes of 45 students a year and three part-time classes of 45 students a year with a maximum of 13 class at one time in a year.

Admit one full-time class of 45 students that started the prerequisite classes on July 20, 2026 to the LVN program scheduled to start on October 5, 2026 that will graduate on February 4, 2028.

Admit one part time class of 45 students that started the prerequisite classes on September 21, 2026 to the LVN program scheduled to start on February 1, 2027 that will graduate on December 21, 2028.

BACKGROUND:

The Program has an approved pattern of admission to offer a 60-week full-time class and a 90-week part-time class. The Program's approved pattern of admission is four full-time classes of 45 students a year replacing graduating classes, and three part-time classes of 45 students a year. Currently, the program is out of compliance with this pattern of admission and has 13 classes in session at the same time and is not replacing graduating classes.

The Program was admitting students outside their pattern of admission with 13 classes running at one time during the month of August 2026. On June 22, 2026 a violation letter was sent to cease admitting students; however, the Program continued to admit a part-time class, which started on July 20, 2026. The Program has also been admitting more than 45 students at a time with the last three classes of 49 students.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The NEC reviewed and analyzed the documents provided by the Program Director to verify adequate resources including clinical facilities and classrooms to accommodate the students' learning needs and ability to meet the Program's approved objectives.

Submitted documentation by the Program Director substantiates adequate resources including faculty and facilities for fundamentals and medical surgical clinical rotations but the Program has only one facility for students to achieve programmatic learning objectives in maternity and pediatric clinical rotations. Only having one facility for maternity and pediatrics is concerning as all the Stanbridge campuses use the same facilities and when there are displacements, there are no alternatives for student clinical placement. On July 31, 2026, the Program Director submitted two applications for Maternity and Pediatric sites.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Deny the Program's request to revise the pattern of admission from admission of four full-time classes of 45 students a year and three part-time classes of 45 students a year replacing graduating classes only to four full-time classes of 45 students a year and three part-time classes of 45 students a year with a maximum of 13 class at one time in a year.
2. Rescind the Program's pattern of admission of four full-time classes of 45 students a year and three part-time classes of 45 students a year replacing graduating classes only.
3. Approve the Program's request to admit one full-time class of 45 students that started the prerequisite classes on July 20, 2026 to the LVN program scheduled to start on October 5, 2026 that will graduate on February 4, 2028.
4. Approve the Program's request to admit one part time class of 45 students that started the prerequisite classes on September 21, 2026 to the LVN program scheduled to start on February 1, 2027 that will graduate on December 21, 2028.
5. Require the Program to comply with all requirements listed below.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

1. Notify the NEC in the event a current class is displaced from clinical sites.
2. Require the Program, when requesting approval to admit students, to:
 - a. Submit all documentation in final form, using forms provided by the BVNPT, no later than two months prior to the requested start date for the class.

- b. Provide documentation that adequate resources, i.e., faculty and facilities, are available to support each admitted class of students.
 - c. Maintain an average annual pass rate that is compliant with California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(l).
3. Comply with all of the approval standards set forth in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing with California Business and Professions Code Section 2880, and in Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, commencing with Section 2525.
4. Board staff will continue to monitor the Program's effectiveness by tracking class admissions, the effectiveness of employed interventions, and the Program's licensure examination pass rates each quarter.
5. Any material changes in circumstances affecting any information contained in the documents submitted by the Program to the Board require the Program to notify the NEC immediately, in writing.

RELEVANT PROGRAM ELEMENTS

Enrollment

California Code of Regulations, Title 16. Section 2530(k) states:

The program shall have prior Board approval to increase the number of students per class and/or increase the frequency of admission of classes. Criteria to evaluate a school's request to increase the number of students per class and/or increase the frequency of class admissions include but are not limited to: (1) Sufficient program resources as specified in Section 2530(a). (2) Adequacy of clinical experience as specified in Section 2534. (3) Licensure examination pass rates as specified in Section 2530(l).

The Program is approved to offer a 60-week full-time class and a 90-week part-time class. The Program's current approved pattern of admission is four full-time classes of 45 students a year replacing graduating classes and three part-time classes of 45 students a year replacing graduating students only.

The following table represents current and projected student enrollment based on current and proposed class starts and completion dates. The table indicates a maximum enrollment of 429 students for the period June 2024 through September 2026.

Licensing Examination Statistics

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(I) states:

The program shall maintain a yearly average minimum pass rate on the licensure examination that does not fall below 10 percentage points of the state average pass rate for first time candidates of approved vocational nursing schools for the same period.

The following statistics, furnished by Pearson Vue and published by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing as “Jurisdictional Summary of All First-Time Candidates Educated in Member Board Jurisdiction,” for the period July 2024 through June 2026, specify the pass percentage rate for graduates of the Program on the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical/Vocational Nurses (NCLEX-PN®) and the variance from the state average annual pass rates.

*The Annual Pass Rate changes every quarter. It is calculated by dividing the number of candidates who passed during the current and previous three quarters by the number of candidates who tested during the same period. If no data is available for the relevant period, the statistic is carried over from the last quarter for which data is available.

Based on the most current data available (April–June 2026), the Program’s average annual pass rate is 92 percent. The California average annual pass rate for graduates from approved vocational nursing programs who took the NCLEX-PN® for the first time during the same period is 81 percent. The average annual pass rate for the Program is 11 percent above the state average annual pass rate.

Faculty and Facilities

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2534(d) states:

For supervision of clinical experience, there shall be a maximum of 15 students for each instructor.

The current number of approved faculty totals 60, including the Program Director. The Program Director has 100 percent administrative duties. Of the total faculty, 54 are designated to teach clinical. Based upon a maximum proposed enrollment of 429 students, 29 instructors are required for clinical supervision. The utilization of faculty at clinical facilities is such that clinical instruction is covered adequately.

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2534(b) states:

Schools shall have clinical facilities adequate as to number, type, and variety of patients treated, to provide clinical experience for all students in the areas specified by Section 2533. There must be available for student assignment, an adequate daily census of patients to afford a variety of clinical experiences consistent with competency-based objectives and theory being taught. Clinical objectives which students are expected to master shall be posted on patient care units utilized for clinical experience.

Submitted documentation indicates the Program has sufficient clinical facilities to afford the number, type and variety of patients that will provide clinical experience consistent with approved competency-based objectives and theory being taught for current and proposed student enrollment except for Maternity and Pediatrics. The Program has two Maternity sites and one pediatric which have had substantial displacements recently. The following identifies recent displacements from Whittier Medical Center Pediatric site:

Concerns Regarding Faculty

Faculty turnover:

Faculty:

There were six identified faculty members teaching in the LVN Program without having received BVNPT approval, as required by Section 2529 of Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations.

The Program maintains an adequate number of instructors to meet regulations for placement in the clinical facilities. Over the last five years 89 instructors have been hired, 26 have resigned or were terminated and 63 remain teaching. This is an attrition of 30%. The chart below identifies the instructor's attrition for the last six years since the Program started.

Other Considerations

In a span of three months, Stanbridge University, Los Angeles, Vocational Nursing Program has received two violations under Dr. Sabi Uddin the Program Director,

Violation # 1

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2529(a) requires an institution to submit qualifications of proposed faculty members for approval by the Board prior to employment. The Director of Nursing is required to submit a form *55M-10 Revised 02/2024*) for each proposed faculty member as described in Section 2529.

Violation: Upon review of documentation of faculty and facility sheets for Stanbridge Los Angeles, on March 6, 2026, the review of documentation submitted by the Program Director indicates there are six individuals listed below, with their start dates, teaching in the VN program without having been approved by the BVNPT.

Status: This violation is corrected.

On June 19, 2026, the Program Director submitted faculty verification forms for all faculty which were then approved.

Violation # 2

California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(k). General Requirements. The program shall have prior Board approval to increase the number of students per class and/or increase the frequency of admission of classes. Criteria to evaluate a school's request to increase the number of students per class and/or increase the frequency of class admissions include but are not limited to:

- (1) Sufficient program resources as specified in Section 2530(a).
- (2) Adequacy of clinical experience as specified in Section 2534.
- (3) Licensure examination pass rates as specified in Section 2530(l).

Violation: On June 19, 2026, the Program Director submitted a current enrollment table that demonstrated six full-time classes and five part-time classes. The Program did not have prior BVNPT approval to add additional classes. The pattern of admission is for four full-time and three part-times classes, replacing graduating classes. Classes are not replacing graduating classes, as required. There is a question regarding the number of classes in session at one time. There is also a question of sufficient resources for the enrolled students in pediatrics and maternity rotations.

Status: This violation is **not** corrected.

STANBRIDGE UNIVERSITY, LOS ANGELES VOCATIONAL NURSING PROGRAM

Program History

- On October 2, 2018, the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (Board), considered the Nursing Education Consultant's report relative to Stanbridge University, Los Angeles, Vocational Nursing Program, Consideration for Approval. The following Decisions were rendered: Approved Stanbridge University, Los Angeles, request to begin a vocational nursing program with an initial full-time class of 45 students and four alternates on October 15, 2018, graduating on December 18, 2019. Granted approval for the Stanbridge, Los Angeles, Vocational Nursing Program for the four-year period beginning October 2, 2018, and issued a certificate accordingly. Required that the Program obtain Board approval prior to the admission of each class. Required the Program to obtain prior Board approval before admission of subsequent classes to maintain compliance with the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, section 2526(c) that states:

“(c) A Board representative shall make a survey visit prior to graduation of the initial class. A program shall not commence another class without prior Board approval.”.
- On October 8, 2018, the Board approved the Program Director's request to change the start date for the first class from October 15th to November 15, 2018.
- On December 11, 2018, The Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians reviewed all documentation and information submitted with the request for approval of Maternal/OB simulation and Pediatric simulation. Based on the findings of the review the Board has approved:

Maternal Newborn: 44 hours
8 hrs. Skills Lab
16 hrs. Simulation
20 hrs. in the clinical setting.
Pediatric Nursing: 48 hours
8 hrs. Skills Lab
16 hrs. Simulation
24 hrs. in the clinical setting.
- On October 15, 2019, the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (Board), considered the NEC's report relative to Stanbridge University, Los Angeles, Vocational Nursing Program; Approval to Admit Students.

The following decisions were rendered: Approved a full-time day class of 45 students starting on January 6, 2020, ending on March 12, 2021, to replace the full-time day class, graduating on January 22, 2020.

Denied approval of a part-time class of 45 students until examination results have been obtained for the class that graduates on January 22, 2020.

Required the Program Director to obtain Board approval prior to the admission of each class.

Required the Program, when requesting approval to admit students, to:

- a. Submit all documentation in final form, using the forms provided by the Board, no later than two months prior to the requested start date for the class.
 - b. Provide documentation that adequate resources, i.e., faculty and facilities, are available to support each admitted class of students.
 - c. Continued to require the Program to maintain an average annual pass rate compliant with California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(l).
 - d. Comply with all of the approval standards set forth in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing with California Business and Professions Code Section 2880, and in Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, commencing with Section 2525.
- On May 14, 2020, the Executive Officer approved the following:
 1. Approved a part-time class of 45 students on May 27, 2020, ending September 7, 2022.
 2. Approved an additional full-time class of 45 students on June 8, 2020, ending July 26, 2021.
 3. Approved the part-time class and the additional full-time class with the stipulation that no additional classes are added to the Program pattern of admission without prior approval from the Board. The Program's pattern of admission would change from one full-time class each year to three classes each year:
 - a. Two full-time day classes of 45 students.
 - b. One part-time class of 45 students.
 4. Approved the modified COVID-19 plan for admission of students following guidelines of the April 30, 2020, Executive Officer's letter sent to all Program Directors of Vocational Nursing Programs in California. The Plan is to be used during the current COVID-19 period.

 - 1. Approved the Program's request to admit a full-time class of 45 students to commence on February 21, 2022, with a graduation date of August 27, 2024, replacing the April 18, 2022, graduating class.
 - 2. Approved the Program's curriculum revision from a full-time curriculum of 54 weeks to a revised full-time curriculum of 60 weeks, effective February 21, 2022. The proposed curriculum consists of 623 theory hours and 978 clinical hours, totaling 1601 hours.
 - 3. Required the Program to comply with all requirements listed below.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Obtain BVNPT approval prior to the admission of each class.
- 2. Continued to require the Program, when requesting approval to admit students, to:
 - a. Submit all documentation in final form, using forms provided by the BVNPT, no later than two months prior to the requested start date for the class.
 - b. Provide documentation that adequate resources, i.e., faculty and facilities, are available to support each admitted class of students.
 - c. Maintain an average annual pass rate that is compliant with California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(I).
- 3. Comply with all of the approval standards set forth in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing with California Business and Professions Code Section 2880, and in Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, commencing with Section 2525.

4. Board staff will continue to monitor the Program's effectiveness by tracking class admissions, the effectiveness of employed interventions, and the Program's licensure examination pass rates each quarter.
- On June 15, 2022, the Executive Officer approved the following:
 1. Approved the Program's request to admit a part-time class of 45 students to commence on July 5, 2022, with a graduation date of June 9, 2024.
 2. Approved the Program's request to admit a full-time class of 45 students to commence on July 25, 2022, with a graduation date of February 9, 2024, replacing the July 27, 2023, graduating class.
 3. Approved the Program's curriculum revision from a part-time curriculum of 108 weeks to a revised part-time curriculum of 90 weeks, effective July 5, 2022. The proposed curriculum consists of 623 theory hours and 978 clinical hours, totaling 1601 hours.
 4. Required the Program to comply with all requirements listed below.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

1. Obtain BVNPT approval prior to the admission of each class.
 2. Continued to require the Program, when requesting approval to admit students, too:
 - a. Submit all documentation in final form, using forms provided by the BVNPT, no later than two months prior to the requested start date for the class.
 - b. Provide documentation that adequate resources, i.e., faculty and facilities, are available to support each admitted class of students.
 - c. Ensure that the Program maintains an average annual pass rate compliant with California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(I).
 3. Document adequate resources, i.e., faculty and facilities, available to support each admitted class of students.
 4. Notify the NEC in the event a current class is displaced from clinical sites.
 5. Comply with all approval standards in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing at California Business and Professions Code Section 2880, and Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, commencing at Section 2525.
- On August 17-18, 2022, an announced site visit was conducted. One violation was identified.
 - On August 23, 2022, the Executive Officer approved the following:
 1. Granted continued full approval for the Stanbridge University, Los Angeles, Vocational Nursing Program for a four-year period beginning October 2, 2022, and issued a certificate accordingly.

2. Approved the Program's request to admit a part-time class of 45 students to commence September 26, 2022, with a graduation date of February 7, 2025, replacing the September 7, 2022, graduating class.
3. Approved the Program's request to admit a full-time class of 45 students to commence October 10, 2022, with a graduation date of April 26, 2024, replacing the November 2, 2022, graduating class.
4. Approved the Program's pattern of admission to include four full-time day classes and three part-time day classes of 45 students per calendar year, replacing graduating classes only.
5. Required the Program to comply with all requirements listed below.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

1. Required the Program Director to submit documentation of compliance with California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(h)(2) by September 12, 2022. Submit the following:
 - a. Methodology to ensure appropriate make-up assignments are given according to the Program attendance policy.
 - b. Faculty training on the Program attendance policy and make-up assignments.
 - c. Documents demonstrating appropriate make-up assignments were assigned for missed clinical hours.
 2. Notify the NEC in the event a current class is displaced from clinical sites.
 3. No additional classes are added to the Program's pattern of admission without prior BVNPT approval.
 4. Documents adequate resources, i.e., faculty and facilities, available to support each admitted class of students.
 5. Maintain an average annual pass rate compliant with the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(l).
 6. Comply with all of the approval standards set forth in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing with California Business and Professions Code Section 2880, and in Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, commencing with Section 2525.
 7. Board staff will continue to monitor the Program's effectiveness by tracking class admissions, the effectiveness of employed interventions, and the Program's licensure examination pass rates each quarter.
- On August 26, 2022, the Program Director submitted documentation demonstrating compliance with the identified violation.
 - On May 10, 2023, a new Program Director was approved.
 - On June 25, 2024, the Executive Officer approved the following:

1. Approved the Program's request for a change in the Program's full-time 60-week curriculum from 1602 hours to 1530 hours, effective June 25, 2024. The proposed curriculum consists of 576 theory hours and 954 clinical hours totaling 1530 hours.
2. Required the Program to comply with all requirements listed below.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

1. Notify the NEC in the event a current class is displaced from clinical sites.
 2. No additional classes are added to the Program's pattern of admission without prior approval. The Program's pattern of admission will include four full-time classes of 45 students to replace graduating classes only and three part-time classes of 45 students to replace graduating classes only.
 3. Comply with all of the approval standards set forth in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing with California Business and Professions Code Section 2880, and in Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, commencing with Section 2525.
 4. Board staff will continue to monitor the Program's effectiveness by tracking class admissions, the effectiveness of employed interventions, and the Program's licensure examination pass rates each quarter.
- On August 4, 2026, the Executive Officer rendered the following decisions:
 1. Denied the Program's request to revise the pattern of admission from admission of four full-time classes of 45 students a year and three part-time classes of 45 students a year replacing graduating classes only to four full-time classes of 45 students a year and three part-time classes of 45 students a year with a maximum of 13 class at one time in a year.
 2. Approved the Program to admit a class of 45 students scheduled to start on September 21, 2026 that will graduate on August 5, 2028.
 3. Required the Program to comply with all requirements listed below.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

1. Notify the NEC in the event a current class is displaced from clinical sites.
2. Require the Program, when requesting approval to admit students, to:
 - a. Submit all documentation in final form, using forms provided by the BVNPT, no later than two months prior to the requested start date for the class.
 - b. Provide documentation that adequate resources, i.e., faculty and facilities, are available to support each admitted class of students.
 - c. Maintain an average annual pass rate that is compliant with California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2530(I).

3. Comply with all of the approval standards set forth in Article 4 of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act, commencing with California Business and Professions Code Section 2880, and in Article 5 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 16, commencing with Section 2525.
4. Board staff will continue to monitor the Program's effectiveness by tracking class admissions, the effectiveness of employed interventions, and the Program's licensure examination pass rates each quarter.
5. Any material changes in circumstances affecting any information contained in the documents submitted by the Program to the Board require the Program to notify the NEC immediately, in writing, according to California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2526(g).
